


Figure 3. Select key enumerations in breaches

Top Human Risks: What are the top three concerns or human risks you are focusing on for 2024?



What is Security Culture?

Security Culture refers to a collective set of shared values, beliefs, and attitudes held by the employees within an organisation regarding cyber security and its associated threats.

Indicators of Security Culture



Security Team is viewed as helpful, forgiving and approachable.



Security Team is viewed as a blocker, unfriendly and arrogant.



Uses plain English, transparent and appear knowledgeable.



Uses technical and confusing terminology.



Security team acts more like an advisor to support.



Uses antagonistic and fear techniques to educate staff.


